Nursing Services

The Public Health Nursing Division works to promote and protect the health of Brown County residents through a variety of initiatives. The Nursing Division provides communicable disease tracking, epidemiology, health education, immunization clinics, health screening tests, and many other services to the county. Below is a listing of a few items we do, but not a true reflection of all we do.

Immunization Clinics

The nursing division provides vaccinations clinics and immunizations for a variety of diseases. Regular immunization clinics are held each Tuesday, and appointments are available throughout the week if a client cannot attend a clinic on Tuesdays.

Health Fair with Mercy Health and Adams County Regional Medical Center

The health department partnered with Mercy Health and Adams County Regional Medical Center, along with other Brown County agencies in 2018 to organize a community health fair. This health fair provided access to immunizations, health education, and other health related services. We had approximately 100 county residents in attendance. We are in the process of planning another for 2019 with the same partners in hopes of reaching more county residents this year.

Quick Response Team (QRT) and Prevention Point

The opioid epidemic continues in our county. Both health department nurses participate in the weekly QRT visits as well as holding Prevention Point, a needle exchange harm reduction program. The health department received a \$10,000 grant to assist in our efforts of providing educational resources to those effected by this epidemic. We are also involved heavily with the Coalition for a Drug Free Brown County.

St Elizabeth Mammogram Van

The mobile mammography van from St Elizabeth Hospital partners with the health department four times a year to bring the mobile van to our parking lot to assist those individuals needing a yearly screening. We work with St Elizabeth and the Breast and Cervical Cancer Project (BCCP) to ensure that everyone receives their screening even without insurance.

Other Community Events

The Brown County Health Department Nursing Division participated with Prevent Blindness of Ohio Vision Screening Clinics to assist Brown County residents to receive vision screenings and/or Optometrist appointments and glasses. We also participated in the 1st Georgetown National Night out. As well as the Brown County Health Fair and the Brown County Fair.

Vital Statistics

The Brown County Health Department issues birth certificates for anyone born in the state of Ohio and issues death certificates for any deaths that occur in Brown County. Genealogists may view records at our office Monday-Friday 8:00am – 4:30pm with the assistance of our Local Registrar and/or Deputy Registrar. Our office maintains birth and death records for Brown County dating from 1908 to present.

Ohio's New Driver License and Identification Card

On July 2, 2018 The Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles introduced its new Driver License and Identification Card (DL-ID). The new *Compliant DL-ID* requires more documentation to be presented at the BMV when renewing your driver's license. We have seen an increase in the number of requests for Birth Certificates coming through our office.

Environmental Health Services

The Environmental Health Division of the Brown County Health Department is responsible for managing a wide variety of state and local programs designed to promote a healthy environment for Brown County. These services include food inspections, household sewage treatment, private water sources, nuisance complaints, environmental disease monitoring, school and institution safety inspections, and many other programs. The following section provides an overview of many of the program areas of our Environmental Health Division.

Special Programs and Services by the Environmental Division for 2018 include:

- Agency personnel made 3 court appearances relating to nuisance investigations.
- \$44,031.70 was spent of the total \$168,000 awarded through the HSTS grant from OEPA. These funds go to qualified county residents with failing septic systems.

Household Sewage Treatment System Grant

The Brown County Health Department has grant money available for replacement of failing septic systems and connecting failing systems to public sewer when available. This funding is made available to the County through the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency Water Control Fund. Eligibility for the grant is based on household size and income. This year the county will receive \$150,000.00. The owner needs to have lived on the land for at least one year (this includes land contracts). The money can be used to replace existing septic systems but cannot be used for new systems. If the applicant is eligible, the grant would pay one of the following percentages: 50%, 85% or 100% of the replacement costs. For more information please contact our office at 937-378-6892.
